AVP is deeply saddened by the murder of John Lea and seeks to raise awareness of LGBTQ Domestic Violence

January 22, 2010

AVP was saddened and shocked to learn that John Lea was discovered brutally murdered in his Hell's Kitchen apartment yesterday afternoon, Thursday, January 21, 2010. We offer our deepest condolences and support to his family and friends. AVP is disturbed to learn of allegations that the police are investigating this as domestic violence-related homicide and that the NYPD is currently searching for Lea's live-in lover, identified as Justin Waller. AVP is working with local officials and will provide all support and assistance possible to resolve this tragic murder.

Domestic violence is far more common than people realize in LGBTQ relationships and, at its most extreme, can end tragically in murder. The National Coalition of Anti-Violence Program's (NCAVP) 2008 national report on domestic violence within the LGBTQ communities reported a 125% increase in domestic violence fatalities.
