AVP envisions a world in which all lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, and HIV-affected people are safe, respected, and live free from violence. AVP works towards a safer future by:

- ✓ Providing crisis intervention and lifesaving client services via 24-hour crisis intervention hotline.
- ✓ Responding to the immigration crisis and the civil legal needs of the community by providing free civil legal services to over 400 clients annually.
- ✓ Building power within the LGBTQ and HIV-affected communities through organizing and advocacy.





AVP BY THE NUMBERS

- ✓ The AVP community organizing and public advocacy activities reach more than 21,000 people each year, in all 5 boroughs, providing vital safety information.
- ✓ Last year AVP responded to approximately 3,100 hotline calls from LGBTQ and HIV-affected survivors of violence. Our hotline runs 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, in English and Spanish. AVP provides counseling services in all 5 boroughs. 29% of hotline calls were from Brooklyn alone.
